

FOR PARENT/GUARDIAN: PLEASE POST AT HOME AS THIS INFORMATION PERTAINS TO YOUR CHILD'S CAMP WEEK.

Enrollment Information

A. **CAMPERS ARE ENROLLED** in their appropriate (or nearest age-related) session. You must return the enclosed RSVP postcard to confirm your session.

B. **PARENT/GUARDIAN** (Must accompany child to camp):

- **Session Placement Forms:** Upon placement these forms will be mailed to you. You will be required to complete each form and bring them with you to registration. **NO ONE** will be allowed to stay at camp unless each form has been completed and signed.
- **Medication:** Bring only enough for the week in a bottle with a prescription label having current dates, doctor's name and child's name. If medication is not in an approved container your child will not be allowed to stay at camp. Any medication left after camp will be kept at Tanager Place for one week and then destroyed.
- **Contact:** If you move or change your phone number, be sure to inform the camp secretary at (319) 365-9164 immediately. Reminder postcards will be sent one week prior to your child's assigned session.
- **Drop off and Pick-Up:** Parent or Legal Guardian **MUST** bring their child to camp on the opening day of the session. Please refer to the invitation letter for arrival time. Please note that you may have to wait in line during check-in. Campers must be picked up before 4:00pm Friday. **NOTE THAT DATE ON YOUR CALENDER and arrive on time.**

C. **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION**

- Camp Tanager reserves the right to search camper belongings for items considered inappropriate at camp. These items will be returned home with the parents or given to the camper/parents upon leaving the camp grounds.
- Camp Tanager is not responsible for lost or stolen items. Please do not send electronics or other items that cannot be easily replaced or cleaned.
- Dinner will **NOT** be served to registering campers upon arrival. Please make sure your child has eaten dinner before arriving at camp.
- Pillows, sheets and blankets are provided for each camper during their stay.
- Because of the large number of children, campers will not be allowed to use the telephone.
- Mail sent to campers should be addressed to: Camp Tanager, 1614 W. Mt. Vernon Road, Mt. Vernon, IA 52314. If your child would like to write home during their stay at camp, please send stamped, addressed envelopes or postcards so your camper can write to you.

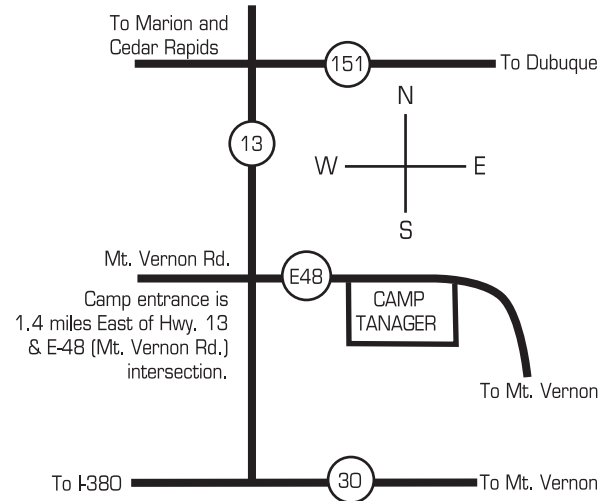

CAMP TANAGER was established in 1926 so children could participate in a summer camp experience regardless of financial circumstances. **CAMP TANAGER** is administered by Tanager Place and is supervised by a Camp Director. The staff/camper ratio (1:6) permits a high degree of interaction between camp counselors and campers. **NOTE: Camp Tanager employs college age students as camp counselors. Camp Tanager is a recreational opportunity, not a treatment facility.**

THERE IS NO CHARGE to families of campers or referring agencies. Campers are selected based on financial need. Camp Tanager relies solely on donations from the community to provide camp activities.

ACTIVITIES - Campers may participate in a wide variety of traditional camping activities including; swimming, singing camp songs, sports, games, educational speakers, hiking, physical activities, arts, crafts, archery, and nature study. Campers will have the opportunity to make new friends and enjoy outdoor fun, while developing their physical and social skills.
